Lunch Payments



If there is an outstanding lunch amount on your child's account you will receive a message at the end of the week requesting payment. We would be most grateful if you could make a payment as you receive your reminder. If this isn't possible your child's lunch account will be allowed to increase up to a maximum of £35.20 (equal to 2 weeks of lunches). Once this amount is reached you will be requested to send your child to school with a packed lunch or clear the dinner balance.

School's dinner bill is around £15,000 per month. Without dinner arrears being cleared we have to find that money from the school budget. Given the financial hardship facing schools this is not always possible. As you can appreciate, we are trying to make improvements to our school by improving playgrounds, building and learning spaces at both sites. Having to find the money to clear dinner debt greatly reduces our ability to do





this. Putting our pupils at a disadvantage. By helping us keep dinner arrears low you are helping us to improve the school for all children.

We are always available to discuss any payment queries you may have, you can contact the office in person, by phone or email and we will do our best to help you sort the issue.

If you think that you may be entitled to free school meals for your child, please apply using the following link Children and families: Apply for free school meals | Introduction – Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council

If your child is in any of the following classes – Kingfisher, Skylark, Nightingale or Puffin – they will automatically receive a Universal Free School Meal under the government scheme. However, it would still be beneficial for you to apply for free school meals (using the above link), as there are many other advantages such as uniform vouchers, school holiday food vouchers and free school milk.
