Important Update: Our School Governance Is Changing

Our school is moving from having a traditional governing body to a Local Advisory Board (LAB).

A Local Advisory Board is a group of people who work closely with the school to ensure it continues to run effectively and meets the needs of all pupils and families. The LAB acts as the school's local voice — providing both support and challenge, to help every child thrive.

While the LAB is similar to a governing body, it is more commonly used in schools that are part of a multi-academy trust (MAT). When schools join a MAT (a group of schools working together under one organisation), the way governance works changes slightly.

Brampton Ellis and Brampton Cortonwood schools are introducing new attendance procedures this year to help every child make the most of their learning time in school. Attendance will be carefully monitored each week, with key milestones set across the year so that we can identify any concerns early and offer support where needed.

Children's attendance will be tracked using a colour band system, which clearly shows whether attendance is at, above, or below expected levels. At the end of each half term, parents will be informed of their child's current colour band so that you are fully aware of their attendance record. This allows us to work together to celebrate good attendance and to act quickly if any issues arise. Good attendance is vital for your child's progress, friendships, and enjoyment of school, and we appreciate your support in helping us maintain our high expectations.

If your child has 20 or more days absent, then they fall into the Persistent Absence (PA) Group which is monitored by the Local Authority and Department for Education (DFE).

Understanding Persistent Absence (PA)

Persistent Absence refers to when a child's attendance falls below 90%, meaning they miss a significant amount of school over the academic year. If your child is identified as being in the PA category, the Local Authority is required to monitor their attendance closely and may intervene—offering both challenge and support to help improve the situation. As a school, we are committed to working in partnership with you to ensure your child attends regularly and does not fall into the PA category. Good attendance is vital for your child's learning, wellbeing, and future opportunities, and we are here to support you every step of the way.

Please see the next slide to see how school will be monitoring attendance in this Autumn term......

During September and October, school will monitor attendance weekly and check for children who have missed 3 days or more. If your child hits 3 days missed, you will receive a text. If you need any support, we are available to help.

If following the text, your child has another days absence, school will phone and/or contact you to see how we can support you and your child to be in school.

Please contact school at any point if you have any concerns regarding your child's attendance.
